REMINDERS AND UPDATES

General Reminders

Please write legibly on checks and money orders- Bad handwriting may result in late fees if we cannot credit the correct account.

Rent is to go into the rent boxes at Murray Manor or Harris House without an envelope or mailed to GMHA Office.

Keep common areas free of clutter

Donations or 'free' items are not to be placed in the common areas/at the curb. They will need disposed of by the tenant. Contact Kristine for bulk item pick up.

Multi-bedroom units: Winter clean-up is coming soon – store everything out of the yard. Trampolines, shepherd's hooks, flower pots, and outdoor seating.

Murray Manor and Harris House : Visitor parking is in the front main parking lot. All other lots are for residents only. Please be sure your visitors are parking in the designated area or they may be towed. Single Bedroom Units: Winter clean up may include removing the shepherds hooks from your units.

If you are going to be out of town for any period exceeding one calendar week, you are *REQUIRED* to alert the Authority.

Smoking Policy

Please remember there is no smoking allowed in your units at any time, even when its cooler out. As per policy, there is no smoking on/in any GMHA Property (or maintain 25 feet of distance from any building).

Marijuana remains illegal in all GMHA Property, because we are federally funded.



Pet Policy

Pets need to be approved prior to bringing them in the unit



Pets are not allowed in common areas.



Bulk Items Policy

Donations or *'free'* items are not to be placed in the common areas or on the curb. Items will need disposed of by the tenant.

*Large items that cannot fit in the toters require the tenant to schedule pick up with the office. There will be an extra fee.

Murray Manor & Harris House : Trash collection is on Tuesday mornings, please try to have all garbage disposed in their appropriate receptacle by Monday evening or early Tuesday morning (6am).

Locked out?

Pursuant to your lease and GMHA policy, if you are locked out of your unit, you will need to contact a locksmith at your cost.

Rental Assistance Demonstration

You may have been hearing about RAD? What is it? What does it mean for me if the Geauga Metropolitan Housing Authority Converts to RAD?

Some may have heard that GMHA is looking into the *possibility* of converting its properties from traditional public housing funding to HUD's RAD (Rental Assistance Demonstration) program. PLEASE KNOW WE ARE JUST IN THE BEGINNING STAGES AND ARE STILL RESEARCHING THE OPTIONS. If our application is accepted, it begins a long conversion process. Residents will be kept informed of any changes/progress as we move forward. Most importantly, YOU DO NOT HAVE TO PERMANENTLY MOVE FROM YOUR UNIT; YOUR RENT WILL STILL BE BASED ON 30% OF YOUR ADJUSTED ANNUAL INCOME; AND YOU WILL STILL HAVE GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES.

Please know the GMHA team, including our Board, is taking our time with this decision to make sure it is the best option for the agency and those we serve. Thank you all in advance for your patience as we work through this.

was established for the participants of GMHA's Public Housing and Housing Choice Voucher Programs, as well as those members of the community who meet the income requirements of HUD's Section 3 Program. GMHA's Board decides each year who is awarded the scholarship. The scholarship is only available until the funds run out. GMHA try to award two \$1,000 scholarships to the awardees. The awardee of this year's scholarship is tenant and FSS Participant; Jonathan Naticchia. Jonathan works diligently to balance the life of a parent and a full time student. He shares his gratitude.

"I am at the end of a very arduous journey, one that health educators term medical school in two years" due to its intense and rigorous academic and practical training. I would never have been able to do it without the help of my support system (thanks mom!), and Geauga Metropolitan Housing Authority. Through their help with my energy bills, housing costs, and even tuition via the Jeanne Bostwick Scholarship, GMHA has been the life jacket my son and I have desperately needed to finish strong." - Jon

Jeanne Bostwick

Born December 10th 1922, Jeanne Bostwick was a lifetime resident of Chardon, Ohio. She came from a close-knit family being the second youngest of five sisters. When she was 34 years old, she became paraplegic as a result of an automobile accident. She did not let that hinder her from becoming a realtor, an antique appraiser, and even owning and operating Bostwick Antiques for over 50 years. This business being run from out of her home on South Street. Her commitment to her community was demonstrated by her volunteering on the GMHA Board and serving as Board Chair from March 2005 through November 2007. This scholarship serves to honor her legacy.

A FUN, FLAVORFUL, FALL RECIPE

Chili Cheese Stuffed Sweet Potato

Directions

1.Poke each sweet potato a few times and microwave until forktender, about 10 minutes, rotating halfway through. Set aside and keep warm.

2. Meanwhile, put the carrots, garlic, tomato and onion in a food processor; add the vinegar, cumin, oregano, cayenne, 1 teaspoon salt and a few grinds of black pepper and pulse until coarsely chopped. Heat the oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat, add the vegetable mixture and cook, stirring constantly, until dry, 3 to 4 minutes. Add 1/4 cup water and cook, scraping up any brown bits with a wooden spoon, until the water evaporates, about 1 minute. Add the ground beef and cook, stirring and breaking it up into smaller chunks, until browned and cooked through, about 4 minutes. Remove from the heat.

3. Split the potatoes in half, scoop out some of the warm flesh and add it to the beef mixture; stir to combine. Divide the potato halves among 4 plates and generously fill each half with the beefpotato mixture. Top each with sour cream, Cheddar and scallions.




