I hope you had a chance to enjoy the Maple Festival and are appreciating these warmer days. We've certainly seen our share of April showers, but it's been wonderful to have more daylight in the mornings and evenings – it really does lift the spirits!

We're happy to announce that the generator project for Murray Manor is now complete. It's reassuring to know that we have a place to offer tenants should we experience a prolonged power outage. Looking ahead, we're also planning some important infrastructure improvements for the summer, including resurfacing and repairs to the Murray Manor and office parking lot, as well as the restructuring and repair of the Harris House driveway. These projects should be put out for solicitation soon, and we're hopeful that our budget will allow us to complete both, given how essential they are.

In the coming weeks and months, you will receive notices regarding our annual capital fund and policy meeting, proposed projects, and upcoming inspections. One of these inspections may be under HUD's new NSPIRE protocol. It's important to be aware that the NSPIRE standards place a greater emphasis on the condition of individual tenant units. Therefore, please ensure your unit is in good repair and that good housekeeping practices are consistently followed. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact your housing manager. Thank you all for your understanding and patience.



GENERAL REMINDERS





When placing rent payments in the rent boxes at Murray Manor, Harris House or the office vestibule, be sure they are not in envelopes.



Please be responsible to properly dispose of your pet's waste.



If you are going to be out of town for any period exceeding one calendar week, you are REQUIRED to alert your Housing Manager.



Keep common areas free of clutter. No free items are to be placed in the common areas of property, if so they will be disposed of.



Murray Manor and Harris House: Please be courteous to one another by not slamming doors when entering and exiting.



Please keep all items inside your garage rather than along the outside of unit. Fire Pits & Swimming Pools are prohibited on GMHA property.



Tenants with lawns are responsible for lawn maintenance. If your grass is at 6 inches tall, a lease violation referral notice may be given. If lawn remains uncut after 48 hours of notice, maintenance will cut the grass and a minimum of a \$50 fee will be







When you have trash that does not fit in the provided blue bin, it is important to follow this process to insure proper disposal!

- 1. Contact the office at ksheets@geaugamha.org or 440-286-7413 ext. 107, ask for Kristine.
- 2. Provide your name, address, email address/phone number and detailed description of the item(s) needed for pick up.
- 3. Kristine will set up the pick up date with the disposal company and email/call you to advise what date it is scheduled for.
- 4. Place the item(s) at the curb the night prior to the scheduled pick-up
- 5. Any item(s) with cloth, ex: mattress, furniture, etc, must be completely wrapped in plastic and sealed with duct tape.
- 6. The cost for pick-up is determined by the disposal company, usually between \$15.00-\$35.00 per item.






Family Self-Sufficiency

This *employment based escrow savings account* is completely voluntary and is a great benefit to those who are ready to commit to a positive change in their lives. Many FSS graduates earn great savings, which are distributed at the end of their contract with many goals accomplished!

What is RAD?

RAD stands for Rental Assistance Demonstration. RAD is a tool developed by the U.S Department of Housing and Urban development (HUD) to address living conditions in public housing properties. RAD allows public housing authorities to "convert" public housing subsidy into a Section 8 subsidy that is tied to the property.

Why was RAD created?

RAD was created to allow PHAs to access additional sources of funding to maintain, repair, and replace public housing properties. After a RAD conversion, the federal government continues to provide rental assistance through a Section 8 contract.

Who can I talk to

You should talk with a PHA representative if you have specific questions about the RAD conversion process and the specific plans for your property. You can also directly contact HUD at rad@hud.gov.



Savory & Sweet Spring/Summer Recipe!

This Summer Strawberry Chicken Salad is the perfect blend of fruity, sweet and savory. Topped with strawberry marinated chicken, it's the perfect way to eat a strawberry summer salad, topped with a cool, refreshing honey lime dressing. For the Dressing

1 Tbsp olive oil

2 Tbsp lemon juice

1 Tbsp lime juice

2 Tbsp honey

1/2 cup Whole Milk Greek Yogurt

For the Strawberry Marinade

1 pound strawberries, sliced about 2

cups

2 Tbsp coconut sugar

2 Tbsp water

1 Tbsp lemon juice

1/4 cup goat cheese 1/2 cup strawberries, sliced

Strawberry Salad

1 avocado, sliced

4-6 cups salad greens

Ingredients For the Chicken

16 oz chicken, cut and grilled

Instructions

Preheat oven to 400 degrees.

Season chicken with olive oil and favorite spices.

Place chicken in baking pan and bake for 10 minutes, before turning over and baking for 15-20 more minutes, or until cooked throughout.

While chicken is baking, start your marinade. Mix strawberries, coconut sugar, water and lemon juice is small pot and bring to boil. Reduce the heat and simmer, until the sauce begins to thicken (about 10 minutes). Continue simmering until it gets syrupy.

Lastly, prepare your salad greens. Top with avocado, goat cheese and diced strawberries. Prepare ingredients for your dressing and mix. Once chicken is done, cut chicken up and let it soak in strawberry marinade for 5-10 minutes, before decorating on salad. Top with dressing and enjoy!


